


Invasive Species

Your WATERCRAFT & GEAR


Clean

Remove foreign material from boat hull and trailer at location of last use. Scrub and wash boat, trailer and gear.

Drain

Empty live wells, transom wells, ballast tanks, bilge and engine coolant lines at location of last use. Allow several days for boat, trailer and gear to dry in a sunny area or undercover before launching.

Why the Concern?



1. Invasive species, once introduced, reproduce rapidly and displace native finfish, mussel, crayfish and phyto/zooplankton species.

- 2. Shell deposition of invasive clams and mussels (bivalves) litter shorelines that can cut swimmer's feet in shallow waters.
- 3. Invasive bivalve excretion can increase filamentous algal growth leading to algal blooms.
- 4. The early immature life stage of some of these species are not visible to the human eye and can survive several days out of the water in moist environments.
